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
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SUPERINTENDENT'S WELCOME

- Current Immunization Record (Student)
- Current Utility Bill (Electric, water, cable, or lease agreement)

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS CAN BE UPLOADED IN THE FOLLOWING WAYS:

- Directly to the online system
- Brought to the campus by appointment

CURRENT STUDENTS REQUESTING A CHOICE CAMPUS:

- Only applies to students rising to 1st 5th
- Students rising to 6th <u>OR</u> 9th must submit Choice cards to home campus.
- Students rising to 10th 12th must talk to a campus counselor.

- Priority given to children with disabilities

HEAD START

The City of San Antonio and Edgewood Head Start Program partnership is committed to assisting eligible children and families of San Antonio and Bexar County with high quality educational, nutritional, medical,

dental, mental health, disability, and other services through strong partnerships that promote success through school readiness and family strengthening.

Child must be 3 or 4 years old on or before September 1st. A family must meet Head Start eligibility guidelines.

We are committed to excellence in education for the children and families within our vibrant community. Visit one of our early childhood centers to submit a head start application for your

student. Our centers take applications every school day.

PRE KINDERGARDEN

Our Early Childhood Centers and four elementary schools offer full day, high quality pre-kindergarten instruction. Priority enrollment is given to eligible 4-year old's that meet one of Texas Education Agency's Pre-Kindergarten qualifications:

- The child is eligible to take part in the national free/reduced-price school lunch program or receive • Medicaid Free/Medicaid-Reduced benefits.
- The child is unable to speak and comprehend the English language. •
- The child is homeless.
- The child is a dependent of an active-duty member of the U.S. armed forces or member who was injured/killed while on duty.
- The child is or has been in foster care in the state of Texas
- The child is a dependent of a person eligible for the Star of Texas Award.

PreK-4 students must be 4 years old on or before September 1 to be eligible. Pre-Kindergarten services are offered at the Gardendale Early Learning Program in coordination with PreK4SA.

MEETING THE NEEDS OF OUR STUDENTS

MULTILINGUAL/ESL 210-898-2059

Multilingual Dual Language Models and English as a Second Language Multilingual Services provides opportunities for students to develop and achieve both academic and linguistic proficiency in two languages, as well as promote multilingual and multicultural understanding in our everchanging society. The expectation is for all students graduating from the EISD Dual Language models to be:

- Bilingual
- Biliterate and multicultural
- Empowered with higher levels of academic confidence, and intercultural understanding
- Prepared with the 21st century skills necessary for success in higher education and the workforce

The Dual Language models (One-Way and Two-Way) are examples of one of these enrichment models. Additionally, Multilingual Services also offers an English as a Second Language (ESL) model.

MIGRANT PROGRAM

EISD Migrant Education Program provides support and services to ensure that all students have a high-quality education. Migrant students will receive the support necessary to ensure that they are ready for school and on time to graduate.

- Students will be identified through our family surveys
- Students who meet eligibility criteria will be recruited through face-to-face meetings with families.

Once students are identified as eligible then migrant staff will work with families and

campuses to facilitate quarterly meetings, provide information to parents about academic requirements, and instructional support services that are available to students.

SPECIAL EDUCATION 210-898-4061

EISD is committed to the success of every student. Because each student is unique, we pride ourselves in creating individualized plans for students that qualify for special educational services The special education program promotes inclusion and provides support for students in gaining college and career readiness and independent living skills. We provide a rigorous nurturing learning environment, high-quality instruction, and support services that enable students to reach their full potential and achieve success.

GIFTED AND TALENTED EDUCATION 210-898-2048

Advanced Academics is committed to providing equity and access for our students who demonstrate advanced levels of critical and creative thinking skills and a need for academic challenge as described in the Texas State Plan for Gifted and Talented Education. The referrals may be completed by individuals who are familiar with the student's abilities, potential, performance, or past records including:

- administrators
- teachers
- parents
- community members
- self.

Parents/guardians will be asked to complete the permission to test paperwork for student referrals by the submission deadlines.

Student referrals to the GATE (Gifted and Talented Education) program are assessed on both quantitative and qualitative measures to include parent/guardian surveys, teacher surveys, ability testing, and achievement testing. Gifted and Talented Education referral window: Kinder through 12th December 2022 to January 2023

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE) 210-898-2066

The Career and Technical Education program provides students with opportunities to gain valuable hands-on experience in diverse careers. This includes industry labor market data while also preparing them for post-secondary opportunities. Students in these programs have the opportunity for real- world experiences through internships or job shadowing and industry certifications.

HOMELESS (MCKINNEY VENTO) & SOCIAL SERVICES FOSTER CARE SUPPORT SERVICES 210-898-2048

Homeless support services: The EISD McKinney-Vento Homeless program is committed to ensuring all EISD children and youth in homeless situations have the opportunity to attend, enroll in, and succeed in school. If you have any questions or think you might benefit from McKinney Vento services, please contact our program. Students in foster care: Title 1 is part of the Every Student Succeeds Act, a federal law that provides services to families who care for children through foster or kinship care. Educational rights are parent-driven in the best interest of the child.

Educational rights for students in homeless situations or in foster care:

• Identification of students

- Immediate enrollment
- Removal of barriers to school enrollment, including enrollment documentation
- School selection
- Academic tutoring
- Participation in extracurricular activities
- Transportation assistance (school bus or VIA Metropolitan Transit)
- Immediate eligibility for free child nutrition
- Right to attend the school of origin or the local school of attendance.
- Receive preschool services, free school meals, services for English language learners, special education, Title I services, vocational/technical education, gifted and talented services, and before and after-school care, as needed.
- Obtain information and referrals from local liaisons, including information about all available educational programs; information for parents on how they can support their student's education; and referrals to health, mental health, dental, and other services.
- Social workers provide social and emotional support to enhance the academic growth of all students. They serve as a link between the home, school and community. Some services that are provided include:
- Family support services
- Crisis intervention
- Home visits
- Community agency information and referrals
- Collaboration with school staff, community agencies and organizations
- Advocacy for students and parents
- Parent conferences

- Individual and family counseling
- Other related services

STUDENT HEALTH SERVICES 210-898-2054

Student health services provides services designed to reduce health-related barriers to learning, promote each student's optimal level of wellness, and empower students and their families with the knowledge and skills needed to achieve lifelong health and wellness. These services focus on prevention, early identification, referral, and case management of health issues having the potential to negatively impact school attendance and academic success. Texas state law requires students attending school to be immunized against certain vaccine preventable diseases. Parents are encouraged to have their student vaccinated before school starts. Students are not able to attend school without the proper documentation for the required vaccines or a valid medical or conscientious exemption. In addition to receiving the required immunizations at the doctor's office, families may also receive their children's immunizations, including for the flu, at the following low-cost or no-cost vaccine locations:

Health & Emergency Information and Food Allergy Request Form

Upon enrollment and every school year thereafter parents/guardians must complete a health and emergency Information form and a food allergy form for their student. This vital information allows the school nurse to identify students with health conditions or special needs in order to provide appropriate accommodations if needed. Please make sure that all emergency contact telephone numbers are accurate and up to date in case we need to reach you.

STUDENT NUTRITION 210-898-4037

As part of EISD's participation in the federal Child Nutrition program administered by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, all students receive breakfast and lunch at no cost, regardless of ability to pay. Supper and after-school snacks also are available to students at no cost at sites participating in an after- school academic program. All menu items and foods served to the students meet and/ or exceed the guidelines set forth by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Menu items are tested for palatability and favorability through cuttings and samplings for individual groups often provided by brand representatives. New food lines, products and recipes are offered on the menu and short surveys conducted during meal service prior to February of each when the upcoming SY menu is compiled. TRANSPORTATION 210-898-2045

The transportation department serves the students of EISD by providing safe transportation between school and home for those who are eligible to ride the bus according to the following guidelines:

- Students who attend schools within their attendance boundaries and who reside two or more miles from their assigned campuses. Students who attend schools within their attendance boundaries and who reside within approved hazardous route areas.
- Students who attend a choice school will provide their own transportation to and from their school of choice. Students who qualify for special education programs and are

approved for transportation services are eligible for transportation to and from their assigned campus and home.

- Students who qualify for McKinney-Vento homeless programs are eligible for transportation from their assigned campus to their home via transfer locations. Transportation services are provided in collaboration with two or more school districts.
- All students who participate in district field trips or extracurricular programs including academics and athletics are provided transportation to and from the school-related activities.


