Materials

Printed BIRD watching board

Marker

Binoculars (optional)

Bird identification guide (optional)

Directions

Step outside and look for birds. When you see one that matches a description on the game board, mark it off with a marker. Four in a row in any direction (left/right, up/down, diagonal) makes a BIRD and wins!

Continue the fun and see if you can mark all the squares on the game board!

Birdwatching Tips

- Find a spot to sit or stand and stay still for a few minutes as you search for birds
- Stay quiet; birds can be scared of loud noises
- Listen, then look; birds make many sounds... look to where you hear their call
- Look towards areas with trees or bushes; birds like to hide
- Search up, down, and all around; birds can be found everywhere
- Watch for birds at different times of the day
